

Equity-centered CW leadership and advocacy requires us to examine and eliminate biases, assumptions, and institutional barriers that prevent marginalized and minoritized families and children from thriving and achieving safety, family permanency, and well-being.





2022 Foster Care Entries by Race: Illinois




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Total Youth in Care by Race: ILLINOIS

2x more likely to be absent from school


50-75% change schools upon FC entry

2.5-3.5x more likely to receive special education services


34% 17-18-year-olds: 5+ school changes

Differences by Community: Racial Disparity Index...


Total Youth in Care Disparities: Vermillion County




